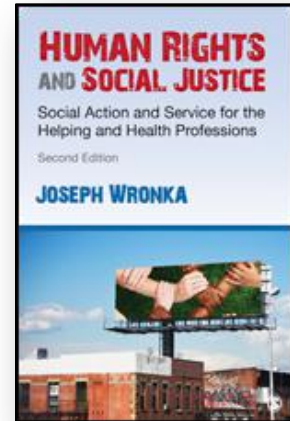

- **A preface reflecting recent global changes** includes the continuing spread of exotic diseases, environmental degradation, the world refugee crisis, and growing inequality.

- **A new chapter on world drug abuse** provides a human rights/social justice approach to policy analysis/assessment within an advanced generalist/public health perspective and presents a direct non-violent social action approach to help resolve this issue.

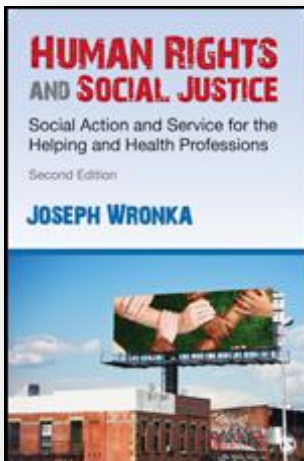
